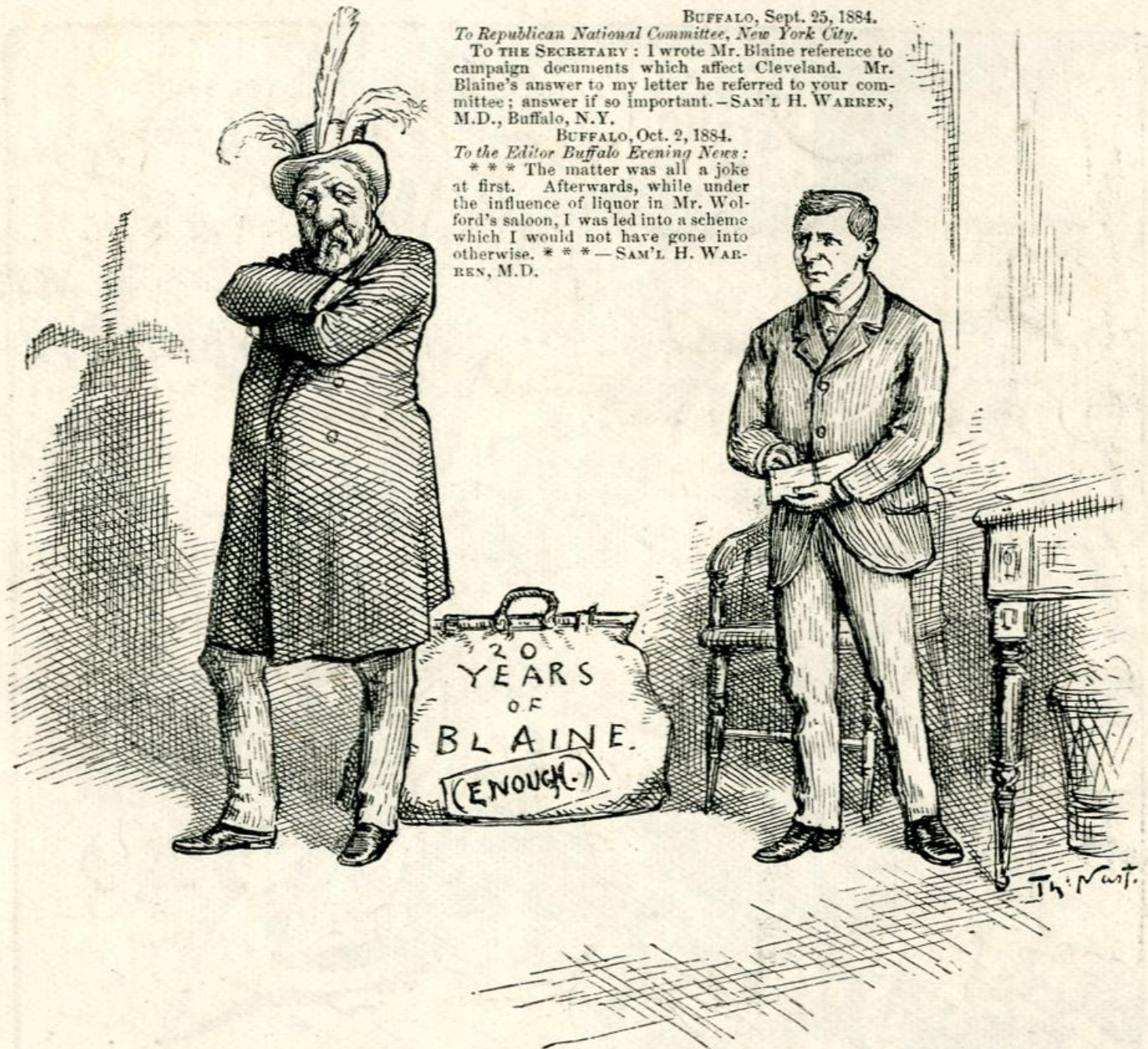


BUFFALO, Sept. 25, 1884.
